


Help! I have hopes that R.S. Prussia members will be able to help answer some questions I have concerning two pieces of R.S. Prussia that I would like some information about.


The first piece is actually three pieces with a metal holder. I believe the holder is solid silver and am including a picture of the silver marks. All three porcelain pieces are marked and my questions about this piece are:

1. What would this have been used for? The two smaller pieces appear to be a cream and sugar, but what of the shell dish?
2. Do you know how I might find the silver maker of this holder?

The second piece is an iris variation mold chocolate pot that I have never seen before. It is marked and I am certain (99.9%) that it is indeed RSP. I bought the piece even though I thought the lid was wrong... but upon closer inspection, I am not so sure the lid is wrong—the colors and fit are perfect—and some chocolate pot molds have different finial designs...what do you and yours think?

And Then There Was A Bowl

In the year 1970 I fell heir to a beautiful Turkey Red (my description of the color) bowl after my Mother's death. In the division of items from my Mother's estate, this bowl was chosen by one of my sisters from a group of four assortments of items. ("Four Females - Four Assortments.") However, my youngest sister made an exchange with Love (my wife) and she ended up with my beautiful Turkey Red Trim R. S. Prussia Bowl.

Months later, an antique trader friend of ours saw the bowl sitting on a high shelf with just the side showing the blown out design. This was all the identification needed by our friend to recognize the R. S. Prussia Trait. Our conversation afterwards was all it took to sharpen my interest in R. S. Prussia. In those days, before the Prussia world, I had been collecting Red Bohemian Art Glass of any and all shapes and designs (nearly 200 pieces) since 1955. My hobby of Red Bohemian Collection was soon relaxed after seeing R. S. Prussia.

After my introduction to Prussia, I mentioned my R. S. Prussia to John Roller, Jr. and his wife, Faye. They were owners of White Horse Antiques Shop and John was one of my very best friends and mentor for antiques. John was one of General George C. Patton's Captains and every bit as good a soldier as he was an antique advisor. We were new to the R. S. Prussia field and our travels took us to many R. S. Prussia markets and a chance to find R. S. Prussia for us or John. I soon found that we could not afford all the R. S. Prussia so I would let John have the higher priced pieces (what a mistake), but at any rate we had a market for our Prussia and our commission from John paid our expenses. It took many years for us to realize we should try to keep some of the better treasures and build our own collection. Still we have

enjoyed many hours on the hunt and made many good friends. We have only a small collection and not too many exceptional pieces but also not many poor selections.

Our new R. S. Prussia Association President, Terry Coy, and wife, Francis, have been my mentor I believe since our first convention in 1990. (I still have coffee in the red R. S. Prussia mug each morning.) It holds just the right amount of coffee and the printed R. S. Prussia - Indianapolis keeps me awake for the hunt.

Terry still mails me brochures of good sales with the auction bid added which keeps me up to date on the latest price paid for each item. Since we are not able to travel too much these days (I am 91 - 92 in August '07), this is the best price guide I could possibly have. Many thanks to Terry and Francis for their great help and answered questions. Also, I feel we are very fortunate to have Terry as our new President and to lead us for the next two years.

Many other officers and members have always been so very, very kind to help us during our R. S. Prussia years. Just a few others than Francis and Terry, come to mind such as C. L. and Lavonne Riley, Eileen Barlock and her early treasures of R. S. Prussia, Bob and Mary McCaslin, and many others that I can picture in my mind but their names

fail me.

After 1970, the R. S. Prussia era, Love and I traveled many miles averaging almost two weekends per month which led us to follow many antique signs to no avail, but other dead ends paid off. This reminds me of one such trip up the eastern shore of Virginia where we traveled (off the main highway) for several miles and led us to about the largest barn full of antiques we had ever seen. We looked for a while before I asked about R. S. Prussia animal or portrait pieces. Her reply was I have something in the house that might interest you. Our day was made complete when she returned with a beautiful Cobalt Blue 10 1/2" jeweled plate. Needless to say that we did not leave without it. The plate is

still in my collection.

Another trip through Pennsylvania led us to an often visited antique shop. Again, the owner did not have any R. S. Prussia in her shop but did have a piece in the house with a goat or sheep on it. I could hardly wait for her return with what turned out to be a creamer with a single lion on it rather than a goat. After several minutes of trying to calm my feelings and deciding there must be some mistake or a fake, I decided to leave without it. The day had been long and tiring but the further north I drove, the more I knew I had made a mistake and could hardly wait until I could find a motel and call back to the owner to save this item and I would be back early the next morning. I did not rest very well that night. My trip back down the highway the next morning was one of anxiety and fear of the owner not keeping the lion creamer for me. At any rate she had held the item for me. I might say here that a little later in the year Mary McCaslin took the lion creamer off my hands. This was another case of not being able to afford to keep an item for my collection. Mary may still have it in her great collection of Prussia. Mary and Bob were always exceptionally nice to us in our early years of R. S. Prussia and a great help in our Prussia education.

It has been a real pleasure for us to share our experiences as well as many great hours while visiting the Conventions with many of you in earlier years but – the time has come for us to think of liquidating our collection. If you have any friends who may be interested in about 75 sets or 170 total pieces, then I would be glad to hear from them. I am enclosing pictures of two special items that we have found in recent months that most any of you would love to have in your collection. I am older now but not too old to hunt for good Prussia pieces. Here's to good hunting for all of you!

We do not advertise in our area that we buy antiques but occasionally a friend or colleague will ask us if we're interested in buying. Of course! Grady likes to buy anywhere. An acquaintance who at times encountered Grady in their work told him of an older couple who were downsizing and wanted to sell some glass, pottery and china. Grady gave him our phone number and the couple soon called.

The first visit should have been a 'red light'. The man realizing that Grady was in sales expounded on all the tenets, trials and tribulations of selling. She bragged to me of all the beautiful clothes she used to sell in a dress shop and gossiped about her customers (fortunately I knew none of them). We left exhausted and frustrated that they only wanted to lecture or gossip.

They called us for another appointment saying, "We thought you were going to buy something." We asked that they put items for sale on their kitchen table with a list of the prices they expected. We managed to buy two Cambridge Crown Tuscan vases, one sunflower mold R. S. Prussia bowl, an early RSP mini ewer and several pieces of Heisey. We of course listened to the back and forth of, "this is for sale, this is not.

No it is, well, maybe..."
FINALLY...we pay, wrap the items and leave.

I kid you not, as we walked into our house the phone was ringing. The woman, "Bring me back my vases! You did not pay me enough. Bring them back right now!"

We ponder taking everything back and then decide to only take back her 'demand'. Besides we really like the Prussia. Deep inside we both think she'll demand it all back in the end.

We return. We hand her the vases. She slams the money on the table. We bid them 'goodnight' and the man walks with us to the car. He hands Grady two \$20 dollar bills. Grady refuses the money. The old man insists. He says, "I always get so embarrassed when she does this and she's 'run off' every antique dealer that we've called. Sometimes she even says they steal from her. You were very fair. You must keep the money for your trouble." Grady still refuses the money. A Second Chance is No Chance

I started collecting antiques at the early age of fourteen and have seen and owned many beautiful treasures. One day about twenty years ago, I was introduced to something so beautiful and artistic that I immediately fell in love with it. That was the start of a long learning process of R. S. Prussia.

In the hay days of the antique shops and shows, I looked forward to the adventure of a new find and talking with people. You could enjoy the excitement of the hunt and a long lasting memory of each piece you purchased. Those days have almost ended with eBay. Most of my purchases today are through the internet and the exciting memories have ended with impersonal transactions made hundreds of miles away.

I have been buying on eBay for

many, many years. In the last two or three years, I have received many e-mails for "SECOND CHANCE OFFERS". A "second chance offer" is an invitation to purchase an item that I had been bidding on, but was not the highest bidder when the auction ended. The individual sending the e-mail states, that for various reasons, the high bidder can not complete the transaction and would I like to buy the item. I know a few people who have accepted these offers and have lost thousands of dollars on these fraudulent transactions.

eBay has finally started to do something about "Second Chance Offers" after about three years without much being done. They have changed the way of recording bids. Now a bidder's screen name is not shown, but is given a bidder's number. With this change a fraudulent person can no longer send

false e-mails. This has not stopped the fraud, but only changed the way these crooked offers are made.

The offers are changing and becoming more and more sophisticated. Please look at these two listings that were placed on eBay. If you look carefully at both of them, you will immediately realize that the Second Listing uses entirely all the pictures and text taken from the First Listing. Looking at the "first listing" you can see that I purchased these two urns for \$8,400 on November 1, 2006, from a very nice lady in Canada. Since I own these urns, the "second listing" is an obvious fraud. Almost anyone reading this listing could easily lose thousands of dollars. The "second listing" was placed three months after the "first listing" and was placed in the United Kingdom. When buying on eBay, make sure you check the seller's past transactions. In the past on the "second listing", the seller had zero past transactions.

When the "second listing" was placed, I immediately e-mailed eBay. I thought they would withdraw the listing, but they did not. When the auction ended someone had bought "NOTHING" for £840 or \$1,651. Since this was a "Private Listing" (which is another story) auction, the high bidder's name was not made known so I could not e-mail them with the truth. So I e-mailed eBay for the second time, asking them to stop this high bidder from being a victim, but I will never know if my efforts were of any help since eBay will not tell you the results.

I do not want you to become a victim. Please feel free to give me a call or e-mail, if you would like some advice.

Second Listing

A Moving Experience

This story starts over two years ago. Sandy and I were talking about our retirement, selling our home, and where we would live.

We decided to move to Reno, Nevada. Our house sold much faster than we expected. We had no place to move in Reno so we got an apartment in Pomona. We got quotations from several moving companies and finally chose Golden Eagle Moving and Storage in Upland, California (agent for United Van Lines).

We packed our valuables and our RSP. Taking much care, we devised a system of numbering our boxes with an inventory of what was in each box in our own note book. The boxes we used were all standard sizes approximately 16 x 12 x 12 for ease of handling. All were marked "fragile" and "this side up" and then their number.

Moving day came and all boxes, furniture, etc. headed for storage at the moving companies warehouse. They stayed there for a year and a half.

During that period we moved into our Pomona apartment and made many trips to Reno where we finally decided to buy property and build a house.

Moving day to Reno finally came. The moving van came to the apartment to pick up the furniture and belongs we had there and then to storage for the rest of our things. Four days later "all" arrived at our new home in Reno.

The unloading started and we

checked each box and item off our list and the moving companies list. After the dust settled, one box of RSP was missing! We immediately notified the driver and his crew. Everything in the house was again checked and rechecked. **STILL NO BOX!!** We also notified the moving company. They checked with their storage warehouse and the other stops the truck made. Again, **NO RSP BOX!!**

After some frustration, we filed our claim. Because it was over the amount that could be paid by our moving company, the claim went to United Van Lines. The claim was partially denied. We were now upset! With many phone call, faxes, e-mails and working with Golden Eagle in Upland, we were paid our claim.

LESSONS LEARNED

1. Pick a good moving company and check references
2. Pack boxes carefully
3. Have your own numbering system
4. Do not mark on boxes what's inside, only your box number and fragile
5. Have a complete inventory of what's in each box

6. Match your box numbers with movers numbers (they sticker each item with their own # system)
 7. Fill out all moving paper work supplied by the moving company and keep a copy with you
 8. Fill out "high value" inventory forms supplied by the moving company
 9. Buy extra moving and storage insurance
 10. Know all your rights and how claims are handled before you move
 11. Make the moving company your friend
 12. Document, Document, Document!

The boys were very excited and were anxious to ride in Pop Pop's combine, help feed the steers, and play in the barn. They were to arrive at the airport at 3:00 p.m. (I am not convinced that our daughter-in-law was as excited as Grammy and Pop Pop—traveling alone with two boys (ages 3.5 and 1.5, two car seats, stroller, luggage, and herself.)

So with two destinations (both favorites), we were eager to begin our day of excitement and anticipation. Our son and his family have always lived in distant parts of our country or the world. We had not been together for Thanksgiving for a number of years. As a Major (Chinook, CH 47, pilot) in the Army, he has been stationed in Korea for two years, Fairbanks, AK, for four years, Iraq for one year, and now one year at CSCT at Ft. Leavenworth, KS.

We, of course, entered the show with the hope of the great find. But with so many quality dealers and one day of the show already passed, it was doubtful that any great pieces would remain, let alone a "sleeper." As is our custom, my wife and I do not shop together. She complains that "All you see is RS! There are many other items to see and contemplate and you go too fast and miss most of them!" So, I look for RS and she enjoys the show. We always set a time and specific place to meet and discuss what we saw, the cost of each item, and how much we have to spend. It seems we always see more items than we have money.

This day was destined to be different! Shortly after our first scheduled rendezvous, I headed to a different section to view the wares. I have made a number of dealer acquaintances over the years and stopped to inquire if a gentleman from New York State may have that special piece. He always has a booth of Carnival glass and RS. True to form, he had both. As I approached his display, he greeted me with, "Hey Principal, you are a day early!" "What special piece of RS did you bring for me?" I asked. Obviously I had already done a cursory look around his booth as the conversation began. There were a number of floral bowls, a couple of miscellaneous small pieces, and in the one corner a rather interesting bowl. I figured that I would take a look at that bowl after our conversation as I left the booth. The conversation took the normal route—"How have you been?" "Are you having a good show?" "How is your partner doing?" "Are you enjoying Florida?" There was some general discussion about the current and future prices of RS and Carnival Glass.

As the conversation proceeded, a lady entered the booth and went directly to the bowl! (No worry, she will look at it and leave the booth.) She did a very detailed review of the bowl.

This aroused my curiosity and I moved a little closer for a better look. (I was also ready to "pounce" on the bowl as soon as she put it back on the table.) To my chagrin, she didn't put it back on the table! Instead she picked up her cell phone and called someone. I overheard some of the conversation—enough to know that she was describing the bowl to someone and advising them that the bowl was in good shape and the price was good too. Then the bomb exploded—"It is exactly like the one you already have." "Yes, I think I can get it a little cheaper. I will take it back home with me and I will mail it to you. No, I haven't gotten much else."

As she terminated her call, turned around and engaged in discussion with the dealer, I overheard, "Can I leave it here and I will be back later today?" My heart dropped, I had missed the bowl!

Later I returned to the booth and the same woman was there. We entered into a discussion and I asked her if the bowl was for sale. Her reply was that she had purchased the bowl for a friend of hers. She was in the RS Prussia Club. "Are you in the Club?" She asked. "Yes," was the reply. "Perhaps you might know the lady I purchased the bowl for. She has been in the Club for

With my head down, my ego bruised, my determination deflated, I said my goodbyes (to the dealer and the bowl!) and proceeded to the end of the aisle to meet my wife. This time the discussion wasn't, "What did you see?" I immediately began to relate to her my tale of woe. She was polite and listened intently, then she let me know that at least she was happy! She had found a rare piece of sewing notions that she had been looking for for some time to

add to her collection!

We separated again, each going our way. Shortly after our parting, another dealer approached me and asked if I had "any interest in an ostrich bowl?" Of course, as real collectors do, I tried not to show too much enthusiasm. I responded that "I might be interested if the price wasn't too high." The dealer proceeded to his booth and produced a 10.75 inch bowl. I tried not to betray my coyness (even though I was very excited, this was to be my first fowl portrait piece) as I spent considerable time checking the piece for chips, cracks and repairs. After some haggling, we agreed on a price.

I proceeded a little further down the aisle and met another acquaintance. "Hey, I set aside a really nice Potocka ewer with Tiffany finish on the top and bottom and jewels on the handle and neck. Are you interested?" "Aren't you a day early?" (We haggled, we visited, and more haggling, more visiting— "wrap it up!") Now I had two fairly expensive pieces of Prussia and

hadn't talked to my wife! I was hoping she hadn't found too many items for her collection. I knew the funds were not limitless. I was carrying two packages when we met. (Remember, I was headed to the airport to pick up two grandsons, a daughter-in-law, their luggage, and two car seats. Of course, Grammy had some gifts for the boys to help keep their attention for the three-hour ride home too—we were driving the pick-up truck and it was raining!) Now you tell me, where do you put an ostrich bowl and a Potocka ewer in a pick-up truck with five passengers and all that luggage? (Oh! Did I tell you she also had a twin stroller?)

In retrospect, that show has made at least two club members happy—Jane and Terry are the owners of a beautiful new bowl to add to their collection and my wife gets another bowl and a ewer to dust! ■





RAMADA FLOOR PLAN




